# Field Notes by Stanley W. Harris 26 September-21 October 2000

For a month in the middle of fall migration this seemed rather quiet as judged by the relatively few reports received. It is uncertain how much of this is because of the general unavailability of the bird box and how much is real. Birdathon efforts provided a few good records, but all in all, fewer than we expect for this time of year. Migration seems to be progressing normally, we have had, to date, only 2 days with any rain, so the generally dry summer weather still prevails.

# Field Notes by Stanley W. Harris 26 August-25 September 2000

Fall migration is in full swing, most swallows are long gone, usual fall migrant waterbirds, warblers, and sparrows are arriving: **EXAMPLES: GREEN-WINGED TEAL** increased at AOP/AMP from 1-5 on 1-2 Sept to 30-40 by 5 Sept, to 60 by 9 Sept and 150 by 15 Sept: **SHOVELERS** at AOP increased from 5 in late Aug to 150 by 1 Sep: **COOTS** increased from 1-5 on 1-2 Sept to 25 by 10 Sept and 200 by 21 Sept: **AVOCETS increased** from 4 on 2 Sept to 100 by 7 Sept and 141 (actual count) on 8 Sept. By the end of the period only a few barn swallows with the odd "white-bellied" were still around. By early Sept a veritable avalanche of **YELLOW WARBLERS** and **COMMON YELLOWTHROATS** had invaded the area (30 Yellow Warblers seen at AOP/AMP on 7 Sept (DF): Just think what we might have recorded if the Bird Box had been up and running 100 percent!

## Field Notes by Stanley W. Harris 26 April-25 August 2000

Gleanings from the bird grapevine this summer have been pretty difficult, and I am grateful to those who made special efforts to report their observations even though the Arcata Bird Box has been out of commission since early June. We never realize how much we depend on something until we have to do without. Let's hope the Bird Box will be up and running again in time for the 'silly season.' Pelagic trips were conducted out of Eureka on 6 May and out of Ft. Bragg on 20 May, 30 July, and 19 August.
